Prof. Yik Sik KWAK, the honorary eHR Information Standard Advisor of eHealth Consortium Ltd., visited HKMA on December 17, 2008 to understand the extent of computerization, the adoption of health information standards and the support in health informatics of our Association. Dr. CP HO gave a presentation on the adoption of IT in the private medical sector and Mr. Clifford TSE, the Director of Mobigator Technology Group (Mobigator), presented on the development of Clinical Management System (CMS3.0) in our Taoyuan Project.

A project team meeting of the Taoyuan Project was held in the afternoon of December 20 to finalize the requests and requirements collected for CMS3.0 in the alpha tests, which was completed on December 12 with the participation of 5 doctors and 2 ISIA representatives. After including the comments in the meeting, revision would only be made to specifications that had been missed.

With the confirmed prototype, Mobigator would start the software development in January 2009 and conduct beta-test in February 2009. The beta-test would require involvement from non-project team members to make sure the system is easy for use for everyone.



Beta-testers should be prepared to make extra efforts in daily practice because the test requires doctors to use real scenario with fake names, to mimic actual consultation environment while protecting patient privacy. Interested members please contact the Secretariat at 2527 8285.

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Cervical Screening Programme



衛生署 Department of Health

- The Cervical Screening Programme (CSP) was launched by the Department of Health (DH) in collaboration with public and private health care providers in 2004.
- The CSP aims to increase coverage of cervical screening among women and to reduce incidence and mortality of cervical cancer.
- The Cervical Screening Information System (CSIS) is a central registry that enables recall of patients and sharing of information among registered practitioners for better patient care.
- All doctors who are providing smear screening service are cordially invited to register with the CSP.
- Upon free registration, healthcare professionals
 - * are required to obtain women's consent and to provide information to CSIS.
 - * would have your clinic name, address and phone number shown in the CSP website.
 - * would receive a Certificate of Participation issued by the Department of Health and educational and publicity materials related to cervical screening.
 - * would have access to registered clients' past cervical smear results online.
 - * would receive statistical reports related to cervical screening at regular intervals.
 - * would receive the list of registered clients due for the next smear to facilitate recall of clients.
- Reminder letters showing the name and phone number of last visited clinic will be sent to registered clients to remind them of their next smear. The women will not be transferred to other clinics for subsequent visits.
